



### **Orange Traveller's Palm**

*Ravenala madagascariensis 'Ambanja'*

Height: 20 feet

Spread: 15 feet

Sunlight: 

Hardiness Zone: 9b

#### **Description:**

A majestic, linear palm with orange colored leaf petioles in a symmetrical display; feathery green leaves crown the plant in a perfect semi-circle; makes a spectacular landscape screen or accent

#### **Planting & Growing**

Orange Traveller's Palm will grow to be about 20 feet tall at maturity, with a spread of 15 feet. It has a high canopy with a typical clearance of 5 feet from the ground, and is suitable for planting under power lines. It grows at a slow rate, and under ideal conditions can be expected to live for 50 years or more.

This tropical plant should only be grown in full sunlight. It does best in average to evenly moist conditions, but will not tolerate standing water. This plant should not require much in the way of fertilizing once established, although it may appreciate a shot of general-purpose fertilizer from time to time early in the growing season. It is not particular as to soil type or pH. It is somewhat tolerant of urban pollution. This is a selected variety of a species not originally from North America.; however, as a cultivated variety, be aware that it may be subject to certain restrictions or prohibitions on propagation.
